Global Countdown to 2030

Countdown to 2030 covers low and middle-income countries globally that account for 90% of all child deaths and 95% of all maternal deaths.

Objectives of Global Countdown 2030



- Strengthen the evidence in support of RMNCAH&N programs through multi-country studies
- Enhance the capacity of country and regional institutions to conduct RMNCAH&N related analysis and research
- Effectively communicate findings to policy makers and all other stakeholders to inform decision-making





The analysis- Continuum of care for RMNCAH



- Situation and trends analyses for key indicators of RMNCAH&N by socioeconomic, demographic, and geographic characteristics
- Using survey data and health facility data (DHIS-2) where possible
- Policy and program assessment, based on the Countdown evaluation framework

Lead actors

- APHRC coordinates regional consortium (research and public health institutions, and ministries of health), in collaboration with CD2030 and Health Data Collaborative
- Oversee administration and logistics for training workshops and dissemination of results
- APHRC supports the overall technical work such as planning and execution of the project jointly with CD2030
- CD2030 and HDC lead in engaging UNICEF, WHO and other global partners, and guide their involvement

Partnerships

- CD 2030 has technical collaborations with DHS, UNICEF-MICS, PMA 2020, INDEPTH and others
- Global, regional and country offices of WHO and UNICEF: inputs into the selection of country participants
- Global Financing Facility
- Regional institutions: UNECA, ECSA-HC and PPD-Africa Regional office (PPD-ARO), to enhance the uptake of results
- PMNCH and local civil society groups: support for dissemination activities including multi-stakeholder dialogues



Global achievements

- Global monitoring products: the Countdown 2030 2018 global report and an accompanying <u>Lancet article</u> (2018 Jan 30)
- RMNCAH+N continuum of country profiles and equity profiles for over 81 countries
- In-depth data and analyses for global partner reports
 - WHO Global Strategy Report
 - Annual reports of the Independent Advisory Panel
 - UNFPA's State of the World's Population Report
 - Global Nutrition Report
- Submission of a 12 papers supplement in August 2019 to the BMJ
 Global Health journal on RMNCAH inequalities

Regional achievements

- Support to dissemination activities related to equity and coverage in Zambia and Uganda, with the country public health institutions as the lead
- Case studies in Kenya and Ethiopia have been completed
- In Uganda, CD2030 is working with public health institutions and WHO to produce an analytical report for the midterm review of the national five-year plan for the health sector
- In Tanzania, CD2030 is working with public health institutions and WHO to conduct a review of the five-year health sector strategic plan and the RMNCAH+N plan.
